

Egyptian Citrus & Mango Price Index

Launch edition · June 2026 | A living seasonal tracker of Egyptian orange & mango export prices
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At a glance

- Egyptian orange export prices averaged ~USD 1,059/tonne in 2024, then climbed 60–70% across 2024/25, roughly doubling in March 2025.
- Citrus value per tonne moved from ~USD 497 to 474 (2022/23 → 2023/24) before the surge.
- Mango export FOB ran ~USD 700–1,400/tonne in 2024; premium Zebda tops the band.
- Mango wholesale more than doubled, ~USD 0.38/kg (2021) → ~USD 0.92/kg (2025).
- Red Sea disruption lifted the Gulf ferry rate from USD 2,500 to 6,000/tonne in 2024/25.

How the index works

- **Components:** representative FOB quotes for the main export varieties of orange (Navel, Valencia) and mango (Zebda, Naomi/Kent, Keitt), by calibre and season window.
- **Public context:** cross-referenced with official value-per-tonne, OEC/IndexBox unit values and trade-press reporting.
- **Base:** 2024/25 citrus and 2024 mango seasons set at index 100; later seasons expressed relative to that base.
- **Cadence:** refreshed each season at harvest.

The ownable layer: representative PEI Trade FOB quotes by variety, calibre and window. **Indicative; confirm against current desk quotes** — the index value (base = 100) is populated from these.

What's driving prices

Four forces have shaped recent prices: tighter citrus supply after weather-hit production; a ~50% rise in oranges diverted to domestic processing; Red Sea disruption lifting Gulf freight; and rising domestic demand and input costs for mango. Into 2026, a citrus production rebound (orange output forecast +15% to ~4.0M tonnes) and a strong mango crop should ease some pressure, though premium/late export-grade fruit is expected to hold firm.

Sources & methodology

Public price points compiled from IndexBox, OEC, official figures via FreshPlaza, Tridge and USDA FAS; the FOB tracker uses representative PEI Trade desk quotes. Price bases are not directly comparable.
